Distilling at the Ranch

The Basic Process of Whiskey Making




1 Preparation

Various grains are ground and cooked. Barley is malted, a process of soaking the barley and spreading it for about three weeks, allowing it to sprout, and drying and heating it.



2 Mashing

The cooked grain and malted barley are added to warm water, which converts into a liquid known as mash.



3 Fermenting

The mash is added to a fermentation tank, along with yeast. The yeast converts the sugar to alcohol. After three or four days, the resulting liquid is about 10% alcoholic and is known as distiller's beer, or wash.



4 Distilling

The wash is heated to the point where the alcohol turns to vapor, but the water remains liquid. The alcohol is then collected in a second container. This process is repeated to produce "high wine" or "new whiskey."



5 Aging

Water is added to the high wine, which is aged in wooden barrels, usually made from charred white oak. Here the whiskey ages at least three or four years, and some are aged up to ten or fifteen years.



6 Bottling

The resulting whiskey is stored in glass bottles, which do not react with the whiskey's flavor.

We are excited to offer you the opportunity of experiencing the art and science of whiskey-making. We are partnering with Wadelyn Ranch Bourbon of Lincoln County, KY, to provide a hands-on experience that will allow you to become a part of the bourbon making process. Master Distiller Wade Daniels will lead you through every step of the process; starting from the mash build and continuing through to cooking, fermentation, distillation, barreling, and bottling. You will gain an in-depth knowledge of bourbon making and get a bottle to take home. Your bourbon experience would not be complete without learning about the history of the bourbon industry from certified bourbon steward, Jerry Daniels, and sampling Wadelyn Ranch Bourbon. We would love for you to join us at the ranch for this unique hands-on distilling experience!

The tour will leave from the Lexington's visitor Center at 7am and we will return at approximately 7pm.

Price \$245- Includes transportation, lunch and bottle of Wadelyn Ranch Bourbon.

Now with the downturn of the tobacco industry, farmers are turning back to the production of wine. Currently, Kentucky has seventy+ commercial vineyards and the industry is still growing. So join us as we take in the beauty and history of central Kentucky's vineyards while we visit two locations for a little R&R and wine tastings.
